This past year has brought us many challenges operating the Club! We have been shutdown, reopened, run at a limited capacity, and shutdown again. It has been frustrating to say the least.

Since the end of July, we have started to try some fundraising ideas to generate income, albeit at a reduced capacity. We covered a lot of information and spent time evaluating the best solution for the club. The information was compiled and presented to the Executive Board to review and present at the December 6th membership emergency meeting. Unfortunately, the meeting had to be postponed because of the shutdown mandated by the Governor. We notified the membership and will be sending out informational letters so everyone will have a chance to review the committee's proposal. The vote will be rescheduled to the February annual membership meeting.

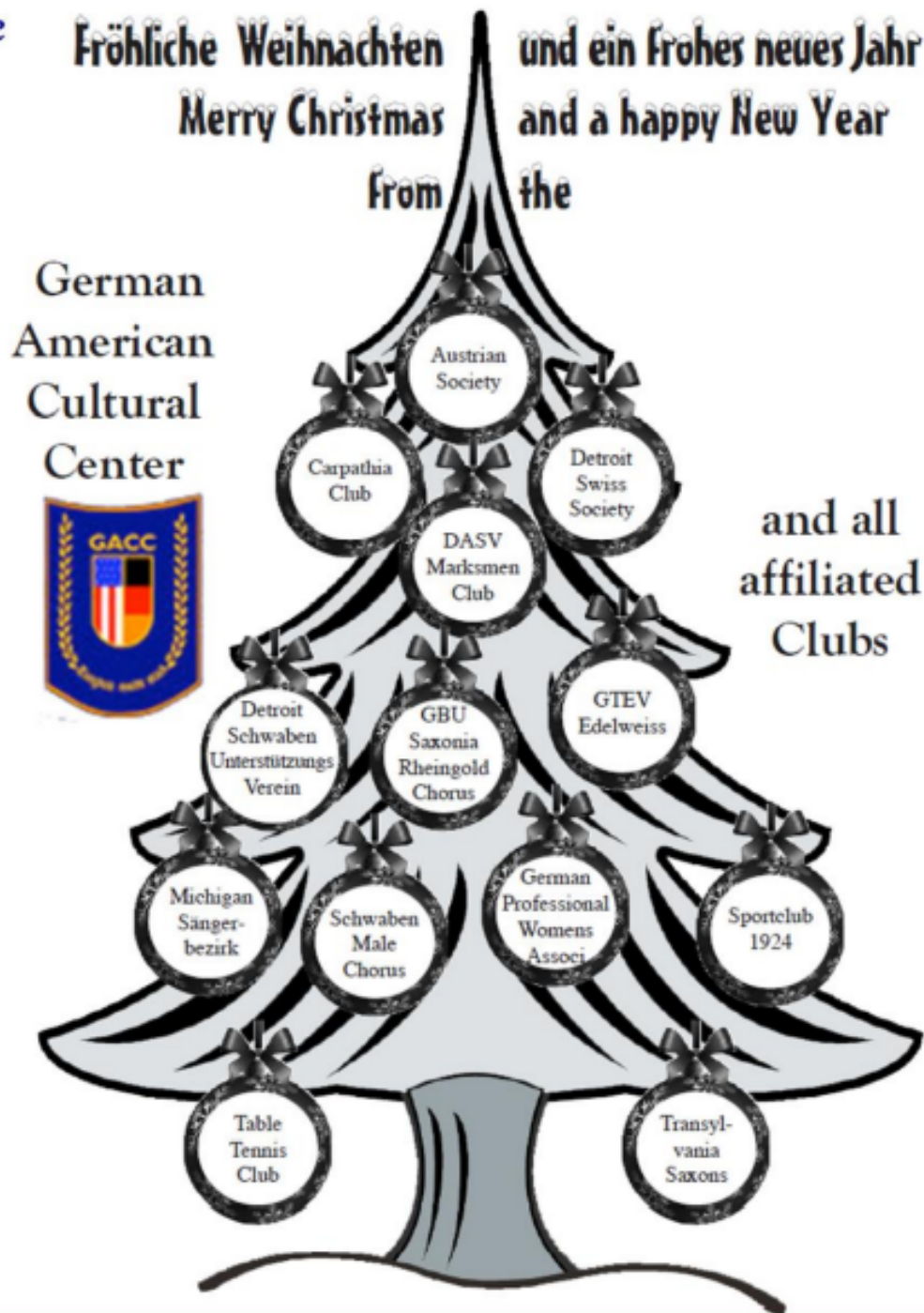

A LETTER FROM CLUB'S MANAGER

Once again, in November, we were shut down from having any indoor events, and are still unable to host any events until Jan 15 (as of the time of this report).

Thanks to Maria Dosenberger repeatedly reminding Alex and I what the other clubs are doing, Carpathia decided to do a Takeout Fundraiser in November. To say this event was a success would be an understatement. Thank you to everyone who volunteered their time and Thank you to all that order food. We will be doing another Take out Fundraiser in the New Year.

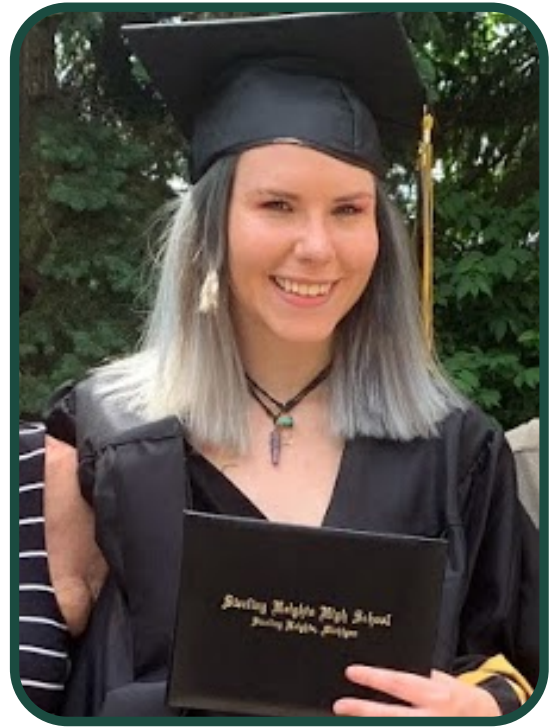

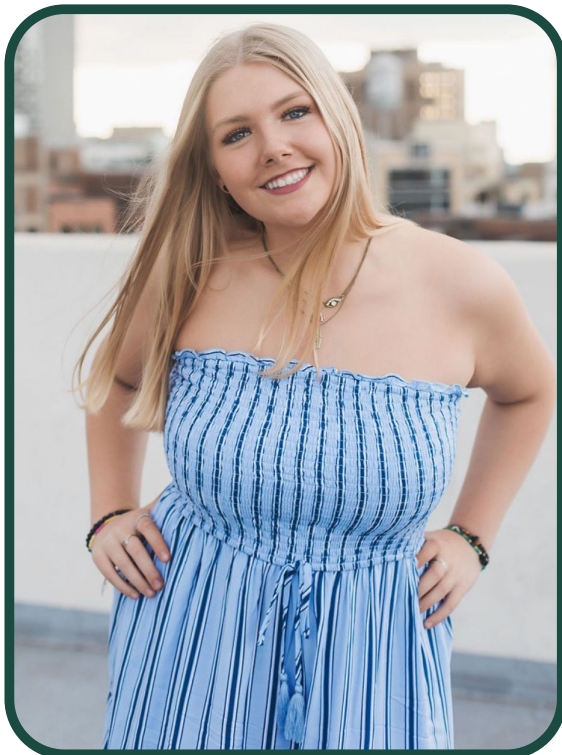

Die Donauschwaben

Die Donauschwaben sind der jüngste entstandene
Deutscher Volksstamm.

Die deutschen Ansiedler kamen im 18. Jahrhundert
aus vielen deutschen Sprachgebieten
in die pannonische Tiefebene.

Sie wurden gerufen um eine öde Landschaft urbar
zu machen.

Ein Spruch sagt „nicht mit dem Schwerte,
mit dem Pflugschar eroberten sie das Land“.

Fast alle Nachbarvölker nannten sie immer schon „Schwaben“,
ohne Berücksichtigung ihrer Herkunft und ihres Dialektes.
Man lebte friedlich zusammen in einer toleranten Gemeinschaft
und respektierte die Eigenart der Anderen.

Nach dem Ersten Weltkrieg wurde das Siedlungsgebiet
der „Donauschwabens“ auf die Länder: Ungarn, Rumänien
und das Königreich der Serben, Slowenen und Kroaten,
später Jugoslawien aufgeteilt.

Unter den neuen Landesherren entwickelte sich die Kultur
der deutschen Minderheit verschieden.

In Rumänien gab es deutsche Schulen und Bildungsstätten.

In Ungarn war man bestrebt alles zu Magyarisieren
und in Jugoslawien musste eine Stiftung gegründet werden
um eine deutsche Lehrerbildungsanstalt gründen zu dürfen.

Der Name „Donauschwabens“ wurde
nachweislich 1922 nachweislich zum ersten Mal erwähnt.
Die schlechter werdende politische und wirtschaftliche Situation
in den Heimatländern, war Grund für die
erste Auswanderungswelle nach Übersee,
meistens nach Amerika.

Nach dem 2. Weltkrieg wurden unsere Landsleute
schließlich durch Flucht und Vertreibung
in der ganzen Welt zerstreut.

Heute leben Sie in den verschiedenen Staaten,
zusammen mit fremden Menschen und Kulturen.

Aber in all den langen Jahrzehnten haben sie ihre Identität
bis heute bewahrt und so wird es bleiben,
den der Wahlspruch lautet:

**Ja wir sind Donauschwaben,
mit Herz und Schwung und Tradition.
Wir bleiben Donauschwaben,
egal in welcher Weltregion!**
